Alternatively, attendees may use the “RAISE HAND” feature to be recognized for comment.

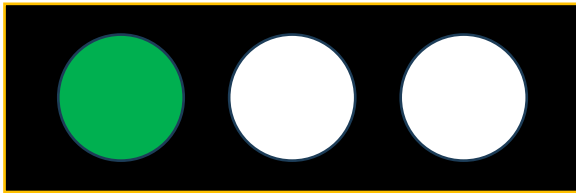

T&ES REPORT

Metro Budget

On January 26th, the Board authorized Public Hearings on the Proposed FY2024 Operating and Capital Budget and FY2024-2029 Capital Improvement Program. The budget remained the same as the proposed budget with the addition of two potential options for reintroducing the 11Y service – during peak periods with 30-minute headways or 24-minute headways. The 11Y service would commence as soon as Yellow Line bridge reopens and the DC-3 shuttle service is terminated.

Public hearings will occur in early March 2023, with anticipated budget adoption in April 2023, and implementation by the start of FY 2024.

T&ES REPORT

I-495 Transit and Transportation Demand Management (TDM) Study

The Virginia Department of Rail and Public Transportation (DRPT) has posted the Draft Summary Report for the I-495 Southside Capital Beltway Transit & TDM Study for public review and comment. This study includes draft recommendations for future transit service and TDM measures that may benefit this corridor. The study does not identify who would operate or fund recommended transit services.

DRPT is accepting written comments on the study until 5:00 p.m. (EST) on Wednesday, February 22, 2023. 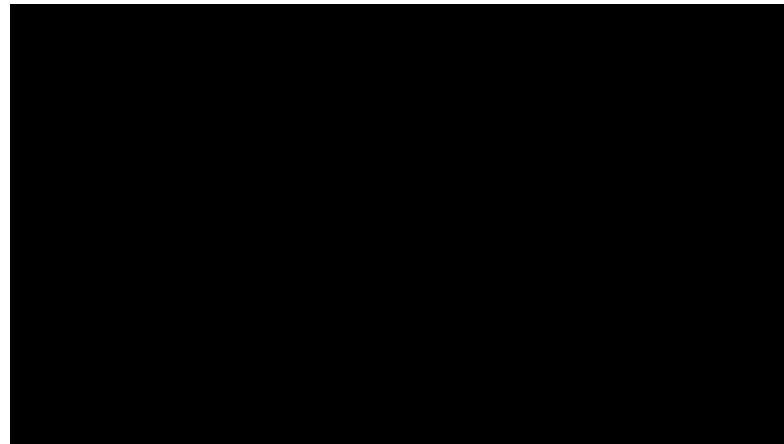

TRANSIT EQUITY DAY

February 4 is Transit Equity Day, an initiative that commemorates the life and legacy of Rosa Parks while inspiring organizations to promote accessible, equitable and just public transit initiatives and policies. Parks became a key figure in the Civil Rights Movement in 1955 when she refused to give up her seat on a segregated public transit bus in Montgomery, Alabama.

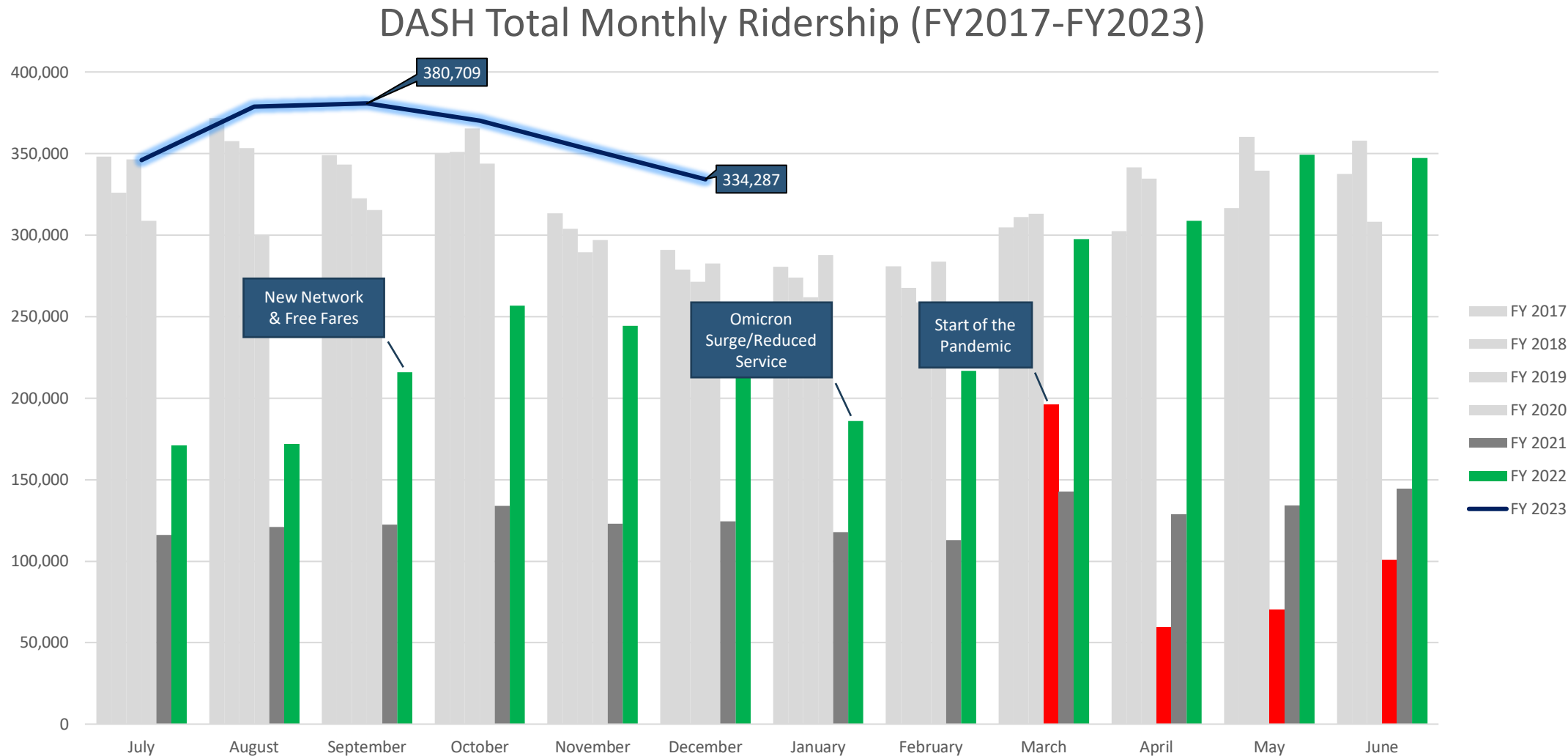

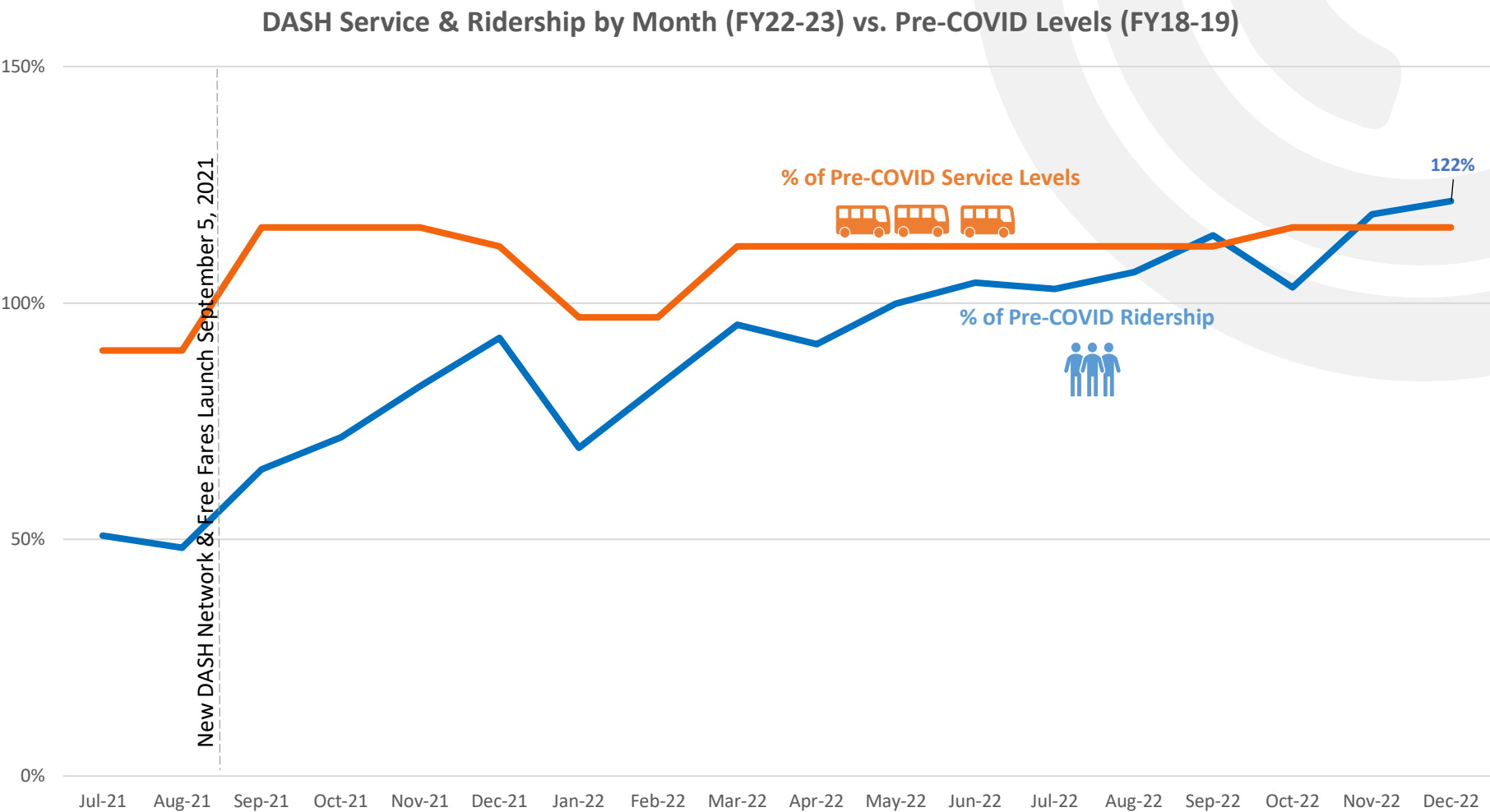

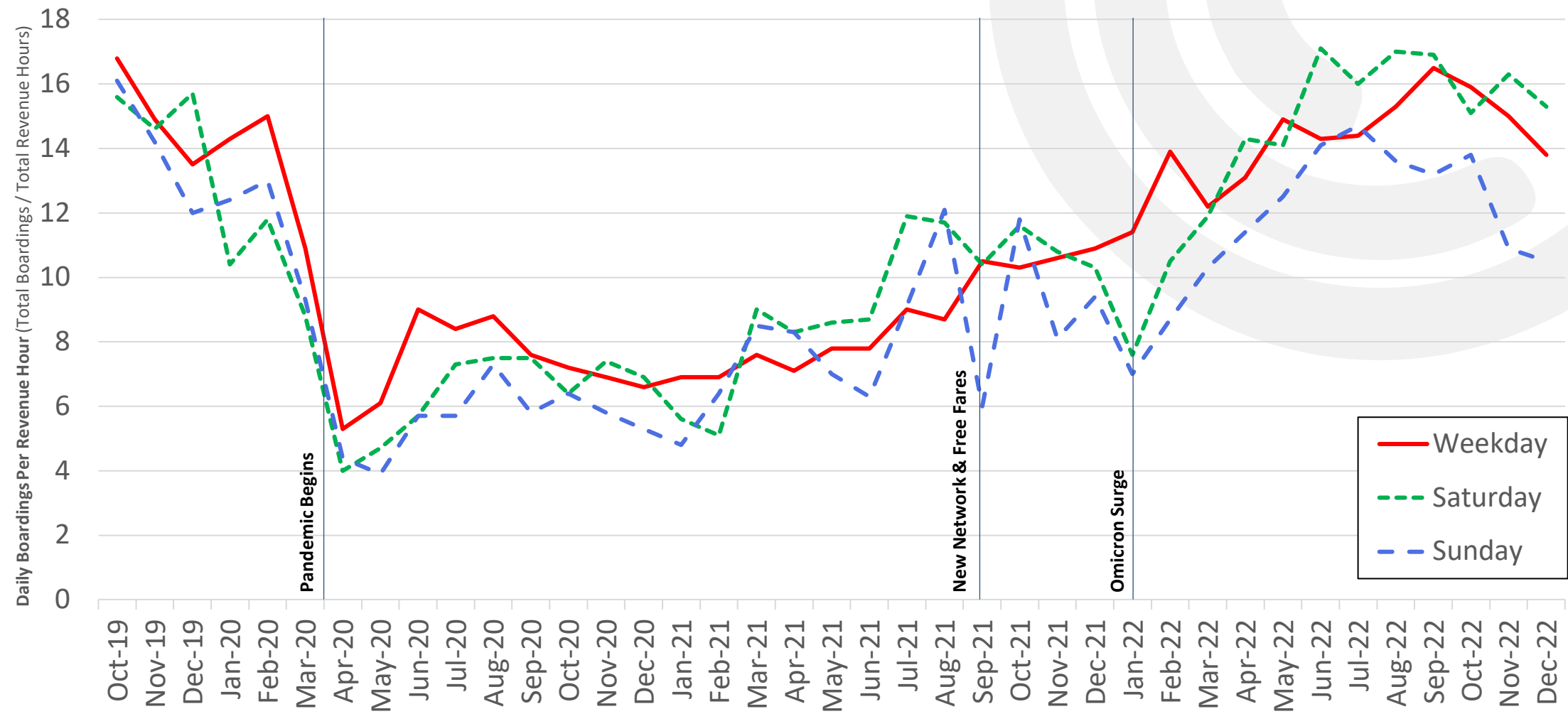
MONTHLY DASH RIDERSHIP FY17 - CURRENT

BOARDINGS PER REVENUE HOUR

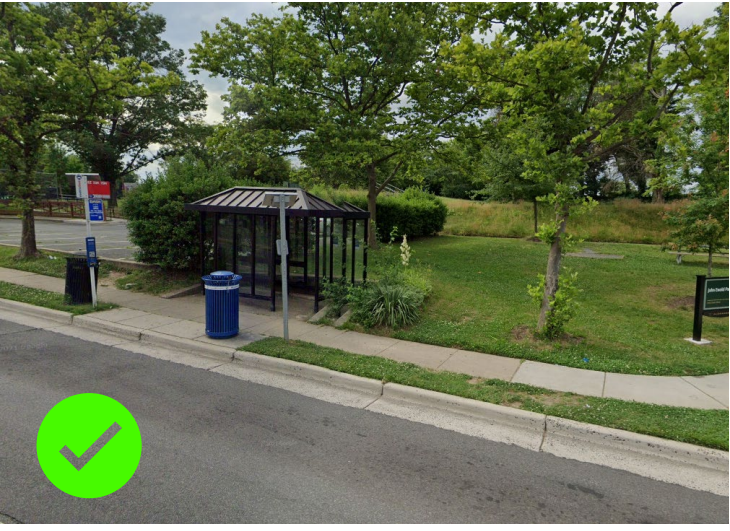
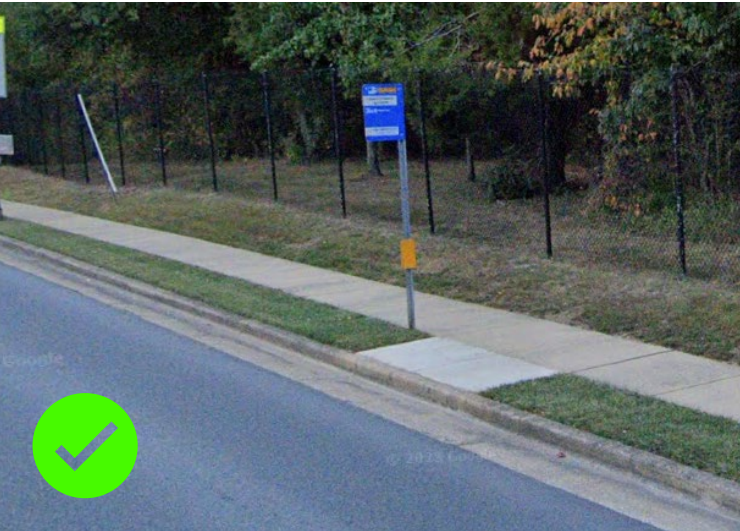


BUS STOP INVENTORY PROJECT

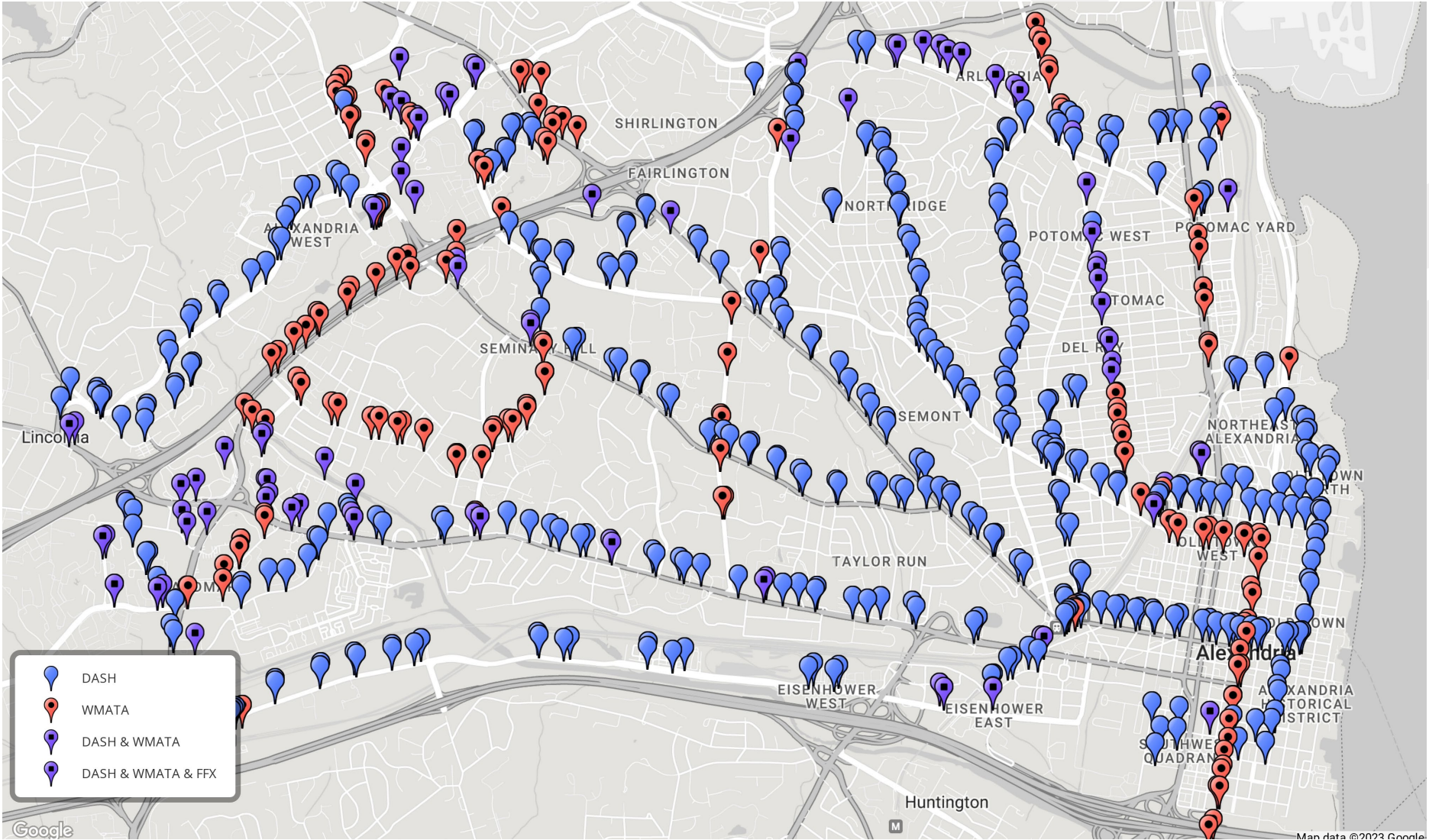
- 714 active bus stops in the City of Alexandria
- 538 DASH bus stops, including 159 shared w/ WMATA
- Bus Stop Amenities
 - 386 stops (54%) have benches.
 - 158 stops (22%) have shelters.
 - 475 stops (67%) are near a streetlight.
- ADA Accessibility
 - 419 stops (57%) are accessible and ADA compliant
 - 295 stops (43%) are not currently accessible or ADA compliant
 - 131 stops (18%) are in a location where parked cars are permitted to block the stop.
 - 46 of the non-compliant stops (18%) could be fixed with relatively low cost/complexity.



BUS STOP ACCESSIBILITY

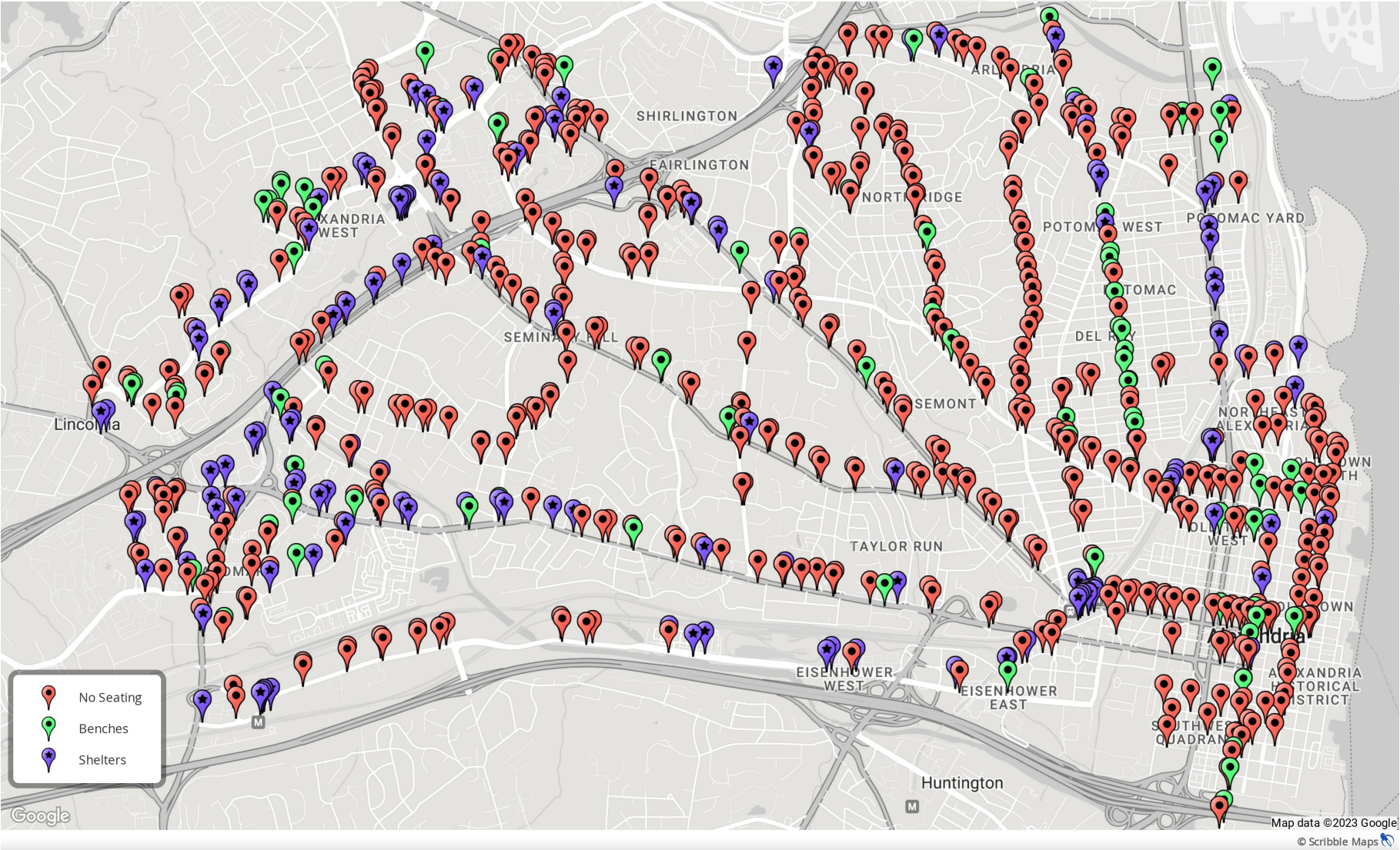


BUS STOPS BY SERVICE PROVIDER

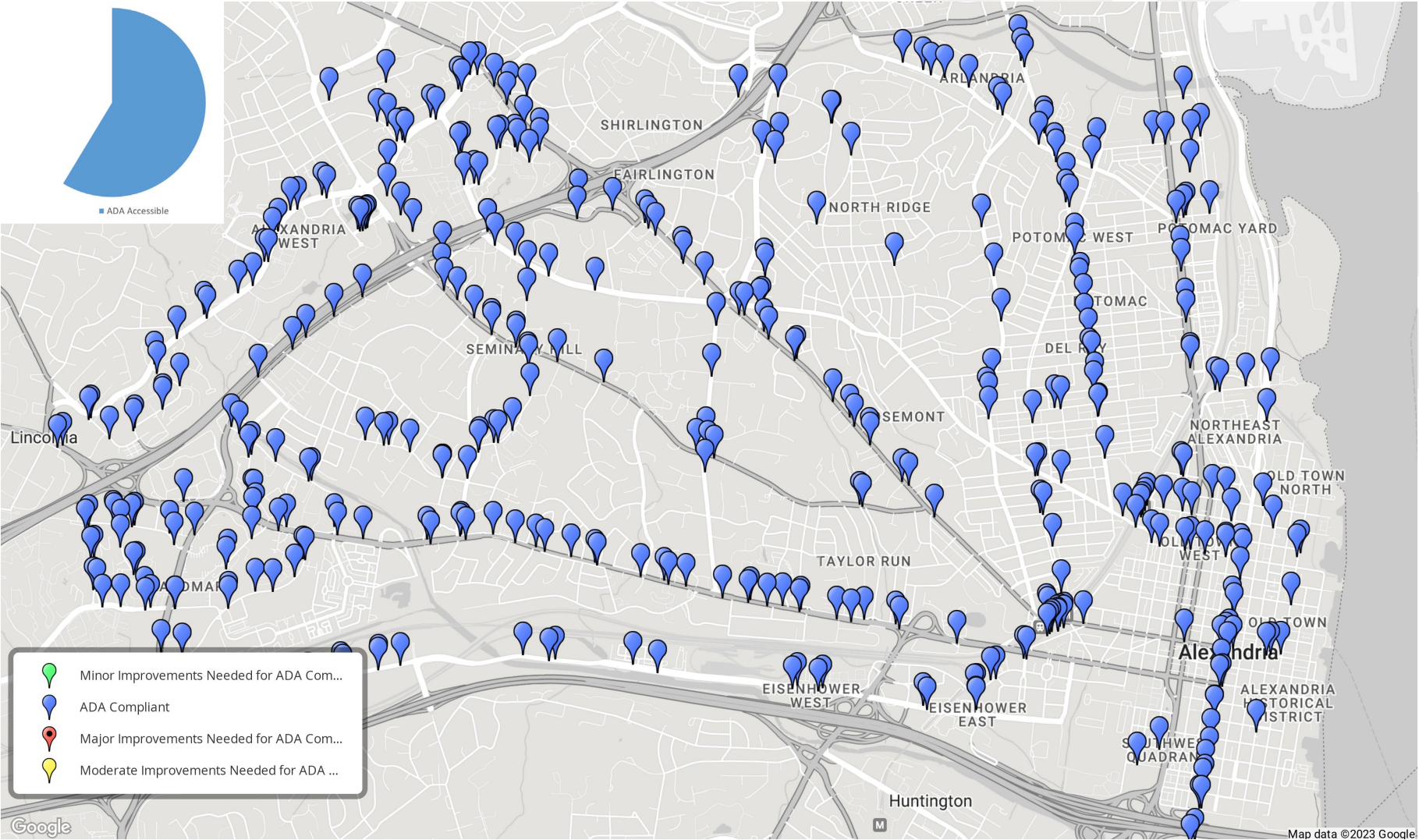


BUS STOPS BY AMENITY

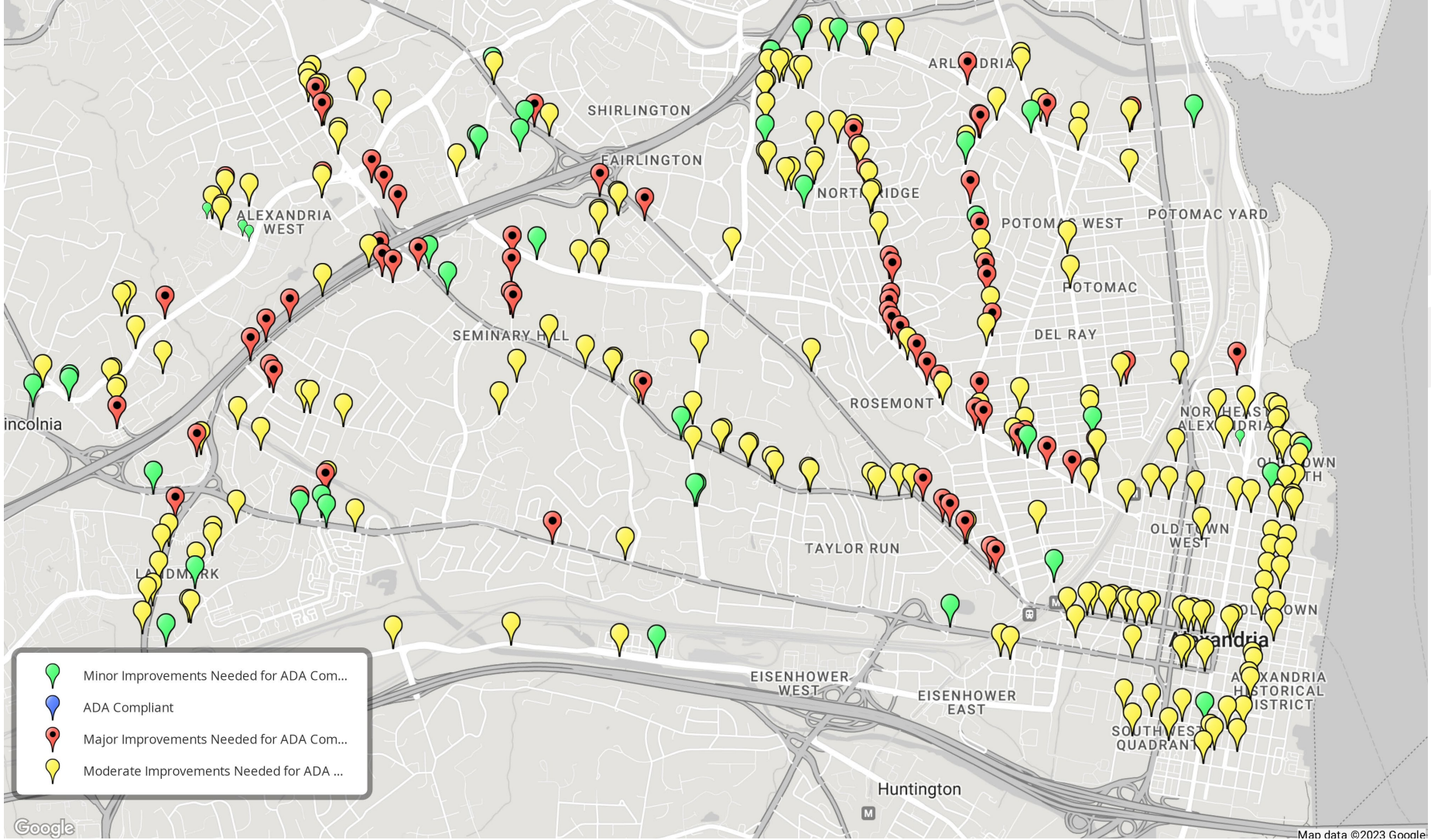
54% of Alexandria bus stops have at least 1 seat



ADA COMPLIANT BUS STOPS (57%)

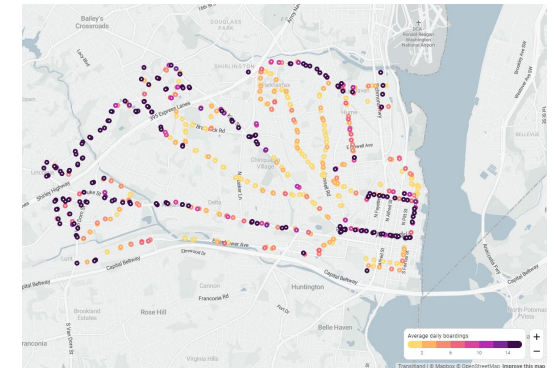
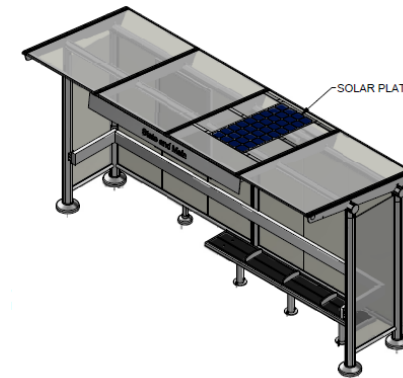


ACCESSIBILITY IMPROVEMENTS NEEDED BY TYPE
